





MISSION

Air Combat Command communications and information warriors provide strategic direction, policy, and resources for four Numbered Air Forces, 17 major bases, and 15 other major units. In addition, they are lead agents for the Combat Air Forces, including representatives from USAFE, PACAF, AFSOC, AMC, AFRC and ANG. The more than 15,000 communications professionals in ACC are integral to the mission of delivering “rapid, decisive and sustainable airpower, anytime, anywhere.” Together, they link systems and programs into integrated war fighting infrastructures, providing command, control, communications, computer, intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance capabilities.

In this capacity, HQ ACC/SC staff fulfills a wide range of roles and responsibilities. Primarily, they establish guidance for Aerospace Expeditionary Force capability, deployable communications, and air operations command and control. To do so, the team integrates and provides life-cycle management for airborne, deployable, air control and survivable strategic systems. To support all functional communications and informational requirements, the staff uses technical experts and consultants to partner with all functional areas, focusing on integrating networks and systems into one ACC enterprise network. Finally, through reengineering of processes (continuous innovation) and efficient use of technology (integration), ACC remains focused on its responsibilities to CINCs, coalition and Aerospace Expeditionary Forces and units during wartime, exercises and daily operations. In these and other endeavors, ACC leads the way for the 21st century aerospace force.
